Cois Inbhir AGM:

The Cois Inbhir Residents' Association Annual General Meeting (AGM) will take place on Wednesday, November 18th 2009 at 7:30PM in Beaverstown Golf Club.

The Residents' Association is the primary link between Cois Inbhir and the local council and other Community Groups. The AGM gives you an opportunity to have your say on the future of our estate and elect your representatives to the Committee.

All Residents are invited and encouraged to attend to ensure your voice is heard.

Taking in Charge Update:

For those that are not familiar with the term "Taking in charge", it means the County Council taking ownership of, and responsibility for, an area. All new estates should be taken in charge when complete, however this does has not happen for 100s of estates across all four Dublin local authorities. The taking in charge process can take 10+ years to complete. We are determined that this will not be the case for Cois Inbhir. Since the beginning of this year, the Residents' Association Committee have been working with the local Councillors, a local TD, Fingal County Council and the developer to complete the estate in preparation for taking it in charge. During 2009, the following pieces of work were completed:

- 1. Outstanding documentation completed with FCC.
- 2. New footpaths across the two green areas (not fully completed).
- 3. Leaking tap sealed and buried.
- 4. Additional sewer entry points were opened up.
- 5. Paths lowered at some junctions to comply with accessibility regulations.
- 6. CCTV work completed on drains.

The following is outstanding:

- 1. Gap between number 18 and 21 to be levelled and fenced off. Alternatively, the development of the two missing houses (#19 & #20).
- 2. New paths to be completed and wooden sides removed.
- 3. Planting of trees and shrubs on the main green.
- 4. The replacement of an incorrect road sign at the Crescent.

The committee are in contact with the local Councillors and Fingal County Council on a monthly basis. We have also met with the Councillors a number of times. The last meeting took place in the County Hall on the 8th of October. This update was very positive and the Councillors informed us that the process was moving at a good pace.

This is going to be a long journey but we are lucky to have the support of local Councillors (Clare Daly, Gerry McGuire, Darragh Butler, Anne Devitt and Tom Kelleher), a local TD (Darragh O'Brien), Fingal County Council and the developer (Lambay Construction) in progressing this matter as quickly as possible.

Crime Watch - Cois Inbhir

The downturn in the economic climate has resulted in a 300% increase in Burglaries. Many of these crimes are committed by opportunist who are gaining entry to homes via open doors and windows. Surprisingly, a key risk time for these burglaries is between 2pm and 5pm.

Locally, a car was stolen recently stolen from Cois Inbhir after the keys were taken from the family home. The message from the Gardaí is to keep vigilant and don't give opportunists the chance to make you a victim.
